## How You Help Me Follow Him

### **Week 1 - Discipleship Happens Personally - Acts 1:1-11**

- 1/ Read Jn 14:15-24 & 2Cor 3:17,18. How does God relate to you personally?
- 2/ In what ways does our discipleship need to be both personal and relational?
- 3/ When does God's personal work in your life affect how you help others follow Jesus?

### **Week 2 - Discipleship Happens in Community - Acts 2:42-47**

- 1/ Read Acts 4:32-37. In what ways is communal discipleship impactful and why?
- 2/ Read Rom 12:4-8. How are differing gifts a benefit to disciple making?
- 3/ What effect does isolating ourselves have on discipleship?

### **Week 3 - Discipleship Happens Incrementally - Philippians 1:1-11**

- 1/ How would you describe the relationship between evangelism and discipleship?
- 2/ Read 1Thess 2:9-12. Why should we 'walk' with a new believer?
- 3/ How would you show the discipleship process on a graph? Talk about it.

### **Week 4 - Discipleship Happens Faithfully - 2 Timothy 2:1-7**

- 1/ Do a quick survey of Acts chapters 4-8 and list some of the difficult aspects of discipleship experienced by those early disciples.
- 2/ How have you experienced difficulty in letting go of the world and embracing the cross?
- 3/ What have you learned in your Christian walk about how to face hard things head-on?

### **Week 5 - Discipleship Happens Supernaturally - 1 Corinthians 3**

- 1/ Read Matt 28:19 & 1Cor 3:7. Considering the miraculous nature of disciple-making, why do you think God is calling us to do what He alone can do?
- 2/ Can we actually live and love like Jesus? How is that even possible?
- 3/ Tell of a time recently when you stepped out in faith trusting God to work through you.

### **Week 6 - Discipleship Happens Purposefully - 1 Thessalonians 2-3**

- 1/ How would you describe God's ultimate purpose for your life?
- 2/ Read 1Cor 15:50-58. Why was Paul so sold-out for discipleship?
- 3/ Read Matt 25:14-30. What do the words "well done good and faithful servant" mean to you personally?
